B. HIGHLIGHTS OF GOOD NEWS IN OUR SCHOOLS:

Stevenson School

- The kindergarten students enjoyed listening to and discussing different versions of the story, *The Gingerbread Man.* The children have been involved in a variety of related activities. Each child worked with their family to create their own gingerbread person. Students had fun sharing their creations with classmates.
- The first graders have been learning about opinion writing, using the five senses. Students wrote about their favorite season and why they chose that season. The first graders also learned about adjectives and descriptive language using the book Fancy Nancy.
- Second Grade celebrated Thanksgiving by making character trait cornucopias. In math they made name collection boxes from turkeys. They finished module 1 in Ready Gen and began module 2. They have begun "Show don't Tell" in writing. The children have been having fun acting out each emotion and writing about a time they've experienced it. They will be displayed in the green hallway once completed. The students will also be writing Haiku poetry based on winter. They will incorporate technology into this project, with the help of Mrs. Perrone, by typing their completed poems on the computer.

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• After reading *Molly's Pilgrim* in class and discussing family traditions, the third grade enjoyed their annual Thanksgiving Feast. A special thanks to the Home and School Association for their help in sponsoring the feast. The third grade students are now busy at work writing their 4 paragraph expository pieces about their own family traditions. Published pieces can be seen in the third grade hallway in the next few weeks.

Churchill School

- Fifth grade students enjoyed Movie Day. Mr. Santana and many helpers prepared popcorn for the entire grade level while the watched the movie *Zootopia*. The Movie Day was a reward for winning Mr. Santana's challenge of being the kindest grade during the Think Kindness Challenge. Fifth grade alone performed more than 5,000 acts of kindness during the challenge. The students would like to thank Mr. Lombardi for donating the popcorn and the popcorn machine
- The Fairfield Municipal Alliance sponsored a pizza party for Churchill School for meeting their Think Kindness Challenge. Additionally, the Municipal Alliance purchased tee-shirts for all Churchill Students for completely obliterating the goal of 5,000 acts of kindness. They should be proud of their achievement.
- The Think Kindness initiative runs until December 31, 2016. Churchill remains on top as the #1 Kindest School in America. If Churchill remains on top it will be the kindest school in the country.
- Churchill School is one of the winners of the Joan Lavine Keats Social Justice Award for 2016. The school was awarded a \$400 grant for the 6th grade Holocaust Unit in Language Arts.
