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## III. CURRICULUM/PROGRAM

A. GOOD NEWS IN OUR SCHOOLS:

#### Stevenson School

- First grade has been working on "How To" in writing and the children are very excited to be the ones giving directions! They wrote about how to build a snowman, how to brush your teeth and are getting lots of practice giving these step by step directions.
- First grade also celebrated the 100<sup>th</sup> day of school by counting delicious snacks by 10s and placing them on ten frames. They also shared Mystery Bags, filled with 100 items. Children wrote 3 clues about what was inside, and the class got to guess what was in the bags. They couldn't believe they were more than half way to second grade.
- Second grade students wrote a narrative about being trapped in a snow globe using the "Empowering Writers" program. Students incorporated all the elements of the narrative writing diamond that they have been working on since September. They also celebrated the "100th" Day of school with many fun counting activities. They have been studying maps and the state of NJ in Social Studies. The children have been practicing the "50" states song to help memorize all 50 states. Also, in Social Studies, they celebrated Black History Month. Each child wrote a biography on a famous African American figure, which included their important accomplishments and why they made a difference in history. As part of the celebration, they studied Ruby Bridges, George Washington Carver, and Martin Luther King Jr.
- The third grade has been working very hard on their four paragraph essays comparing two texts, as well as comparing a text and a movie clip. The students are using their planners to organize their ideas prior to typing and then publishing their finished pieces on google docs.
- On Friday, January 6, the third grade had their class trip to Liberty Science Center. The students were able to participate in many hands on science experiments and watched a 3D movie.
- On February 8, Matthew Centrowitz Jr., a U.S. track and field athlete visited Stevenson School. Matthew won the gold medal in the 1500-meter race at the 2016 Summer Olympics in Rio de Janeiro. Matthew talked to students about his life story and Olympic experience. Students were able to view his gold metal up close.

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#### Churchill School

- The Churchill School Student Council is working with Officer Steve D'Argenio, of the FFPD, to coordinate and develop a new program which will help veterans find employment and get back their independence after serving our country. Officer D'Argenio has attended several Student Council meetings and is working closely with the students to promote this community service project. The students are ecstatic about this endeavor and can't wait to help our veterans!
- Seven students in our RTI Cycle 1, Tier 3 reading program moved up to Tier 2 for Cycle 2.
- The HSA has approved the purchase of new basketball backboards, hoops and nets for the Churchill Playground. Thank you, HAS!
- As a cross-curricular project of Health (learning about the eye) & Science (learning about outer space), the students were extremely excited to construct their own Refracting Telescopes.
- Fourth, 5<sup>th</sup>, and 6<sup>th</sup> grade H.E.P. students are thinking like engineers! Students are using reverse engineering to dismantle netbooks, computers, Elmos, and other computer items to learn how to think like an engineer. In the S.T.E.A.M. lab, students study and analyze these items in order to learn the details of design, construction, operation, and perhaps to produce a copy or an improved version of the item.
- Fourth grade HEP students are also working on creating their own apps in Code.org! Woo hoo! Computer scientists at work!!
